(IPEC) Info Sessions

Description: IPEC is a new RSO, whose mission is to provide a platform for students to gain valuable design, research and development experience in both engineering and business aspects by working on international projects. The current project we are working on is the Trident Mk1 by the Underwater Projects Group (UPG), a highly configurable submarine that is capable of being air-dropped by a C-130 transport aircraft. The configurations that UPG are currently designing are: Search & Rescue, Military, Commercial, R & D. Trident Mk1 was showcased at the recent Asian Aerospace Exhibition in Singapore earlier this year, which UPG participated as an exhibitor as part of the Florida state delegation. UPG is now planning to attend the Farnborough International Airshow in UK in summer, which is the largest airshow in the world. The short-term goal of IPEC is to aid UPG in the design, research and development of Trident Mk1 through the setup of a Systems Division and Business Division. Students will have opportunities to conduct global market research, liaise with corporate companies worldwide, perform cost analysis, design and develop systems (eg. control & navigation, power distribution, propulsion, parachute deployment, composite materials etc.) More details will be presented at the information sessions.
