***SMART Scholarship-for-Service Program**
Application Deadline: December 15, 2009 for Fall 2010 starts

Undergraduate and graduate students are invited to apply to the SMART Scholarship-for-Service Program. Applications must be done on-line at www.asee.org/SMART. This is a highly-selective, prestigious, national program that fully supports their education, including full tuition and a very generous stipend in the range of \$25,000 a year for undergraduates and \$41,000 for doctoral candidates, while they are in school. It also includes a book allowance of \$1,000 a year, health insurance, summer internships, and travel fees for internships. Students must be U.S. Citizens, able to obtain a DoD Security Clearance, and be willing to work in a defense laboratory upon graduation. There will be approximately 300 new awards this year.
