The Information Trust Institute (ITI), a national leader in combining research and education with industrial outreach in trustworthy and secure information systems, invites undergraduates to apply for Undergraduate Research Internship awards for Summer 2011. Selected students will be supervised by ITI researchers at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign who are leading experts in a number of information trust, information assurance, and security research areas.

All interns will receive stipends and housing. The duration of the internships will be 8-10 weeks. The main program will run from May 31 to July 29; if those dates conflict with your academic calendar, other start and end dates may be considered.

The fourth annual campus-wide Undergraduate Research Symposium gives undergraduates the opportunity to present the fruits of their research, scholarly, and other creative endeavors—especially those undertaken with mentorship from faculty.

Over 200 students were on last year's symposium program: 111 delivered oral presentations on panels with peers who share their academic interests, and 96 presented posters that summarized research findings. Over 140 faculty members, postdoctoral fellows, and doctoral students served as mentors to the undergraduates on last year's symposium program; 20 mentored more than one student on the program. We are hoping that even more students and mentors will participate in the 2011 symposium.
